Nadácia Via Pribina bola založená v júli 2012 spoločnosťami, ktoré sa podieľajú na realizácii PPP (verejno-súkromného partnerstva) projektu 51,6 km rýchlostnej cesty Via Pribina medzi Nitrou a Tekovskými Nemcami, vrátane severného obchvatu Banská Bystrica. Ide o spoločnosti Via Pribina, Via Pribina Operations, EUROVIA SK, Meridiam a VINCI Highways. Nadácia Via Pribina patrí do štruktúr francúzskej nadácie Fondation VINCI POUR LA CITÉ.

VINCI POUR LA CITÉ má základne v 14 krajinách, zvýraznených na mape žltou farbou.

Foundation Via Pribina was founded in July 2012 by companies participating in the implementation of the 51.6 km Via Pribina expressway between Nitra and Tekovské Nemce, including the northern bypass of Banská Bystrica. This public-private partnership project (PPP) was carried out by Via Pribina, Via Pribina Operations, EUROVIA SK, Meridiam and VINCI Highways. The Via Pribina Foundation belongs to the structures of the French Foundation VINCI POUR LA CITÉ.

VINCI POUR LA CITÉ has bases in 14 countries, highlighted on the map in yellow.

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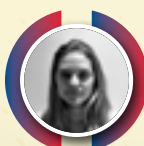
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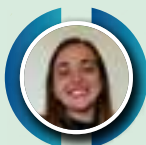
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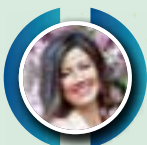

Bánovce nad Bebravou

 Non-profit organization Archa providing social housing to children with mental and physical disadvantages is having a very special Christmas this year.

Their team of a dozen volunteers just completed and unveiled a brand new Snoezelen room, made possible through a generous grant from the Via Pribina Foundation.

Originating in the Netherlands in the 1970s, Snoezelen rooms have become a global therapy resource. These rooms create soothing and stimulating environments, employing a combination of sensory stimuli, such as lighting effects, colours, sounds, music, and scents. The rooms are carefully crafted to engage various senses, including tactile sensations and balance, and in Archa, the clients entering them are accompanied by a trained aide or a therapist.

Primarily, the Archa Snoezelen room is enjoyed by approximately 70 clients. The space is also made available to over 100 students of pedagogy taking their vocational trainings in Archa.

 Drahuškovo Community Centre nestled in the far west of Slovakia, in the quaint village of Krajné provides housing and special care to clients with Autism Spectre Disorder (ASD) who are aged from 18 to 37 years. As we learned during our visit, ASD begins before the age of 3 years and can last throughout a person's life, although symptoms may improve over time. The abilities of people with ASD can vary significantly. For example, some people with ASD may have advanced conversation skills whereas others may be nonverbal. Some people with ASD need a lot of help in their daily lives; others can work and live with little to no support.

At Drahuškovo, a team of dedicated professionals ensures that clients engage in meaningful activities, including a variety of workshops such as ceramics, weaving, painting, and more.

The Via Pribina Foundation grant was allocated for enhancements to the hallway area to protect it from rain and for purchasing several items, including a fruit dehydrator. This allows clients to preserve fruit harvested from their community garden.

3. OZ OBJATIE (HUG)


3. OZ OBJATIE (HUG)

 The nonprofit organization OZ OBJATIE, also known as HUG, is addressing the pressing needs of elderly and disabled individuals in Slovakia who are at risk of social isolation. Recognizing that older age doesn't necessarily equate to a disinterest in modern technology, HUG has initiated a project aimed at enhancing the communication capabilities of its clients, thereby reducing feelings of loneliness and disconnection from family and friends.

With the support of 35 active volunteers, HUG plans to purchase new PCs with accessories and multi-function printers. This technology will enable more frequent contact between clients and their loved ones and foster the creation of new social ties. The primary beneficiaries of this initiative are seniors and disabled individuals aged 46 to 92 years, who will not only gain improved access to information and communication channels but will also receive encouragement to become computer literate.

By increasing the number of places available for outpatient services, HUG aims to meet the growing need for support among Slovakia's disabled population, reflecting a commitment to both immediate and long-term enhancements in community care.

4. NÁBYTKOVÁ BANKA (FURNITURE BANK)

 NÁBYTKOVÁ BANKA, known as FURNITURE BANK, provides vital social crisis intervention services in Trnava, focusing on homeless individuals and those at risk of social exclusion. Since 2012, the organization has operated both a low-threshold day center and field social services, helping clients reintegrate into society by offering practical training in a carpentry workshop to restore work habits and skills.

Inspired by the successful Furniture Bank in Prague, this project aims to establish a furniture bank focused on aiding low-income groups through the import, storage, and distribution of furniture and home furnishings. Additionally, the project includes a carpentry workshop for repairing small furniture items, which serves as a form of occupational therapy. The furniture bank and workshop provide an ecological benefit by giving a second life to furniture and appliances, promoting recycling and reducing waste.

The professional team at FURNITURE BANK, including social workers, psychologists, and social rehabilitation instructors, systematically works with clients to develop their skills and assist in overall personal rehabilitation. This project not only contributes to enhancing clients' work skills and competences but also supports their reintegration into the labour market, making it a pioneering solution for active inclusion and support.

5. ZDRAVÁ SPOLOČNOSŤ, O.Z. – LIVIA ORCHARD

 ZDRAVÁ SPOLOČNOSŤ, O.Z., also known as HEALTHY SOCIETY NGO – LIVIA ORCHARD, operates an organic orchard in Kolíňany near Nitra, established in 1997. The orchard is renowned for its commitment to chemical-free cultivation, offering a range of organic fruits and hosting the eco-centre „Under the Plane Tree“ since 2018. This centre, constructed with support from friends, family, company resources, and grants, serves as a cultural and educational hub for the community.

The project aims to transform the Livia orchard into a more vibrant community space, enhancing access and functionality of the eco-centre to support educational activities with an emphasis on young people's civic awareness. Plans include landscaping to improve access to the building and retrofitting the eco-centre to better accommodate educational workshops, seminars, and other community events.

This innovative approach is set to create a sustainable and active learning environment that fosters social cohesion among various social groups, from children to pensioners. It not only aims to educate but also to integrate individuals into society, making it a model for health-oriented community development.

6. Minifarm Veľké Leváre

 Minifarm Veľké Leváre provides a practical education platform for boys up to 18 years from the Roma community, focusing on developing manual skills and work habits through farm activities. This initiative supports their integration into society by instilling a positive work ethic and responsibility through tasks like animal care and agricultural work.

The project enhances traditional educational methods by including zootherapy to promote mental health among its clients, who are often socially isolated. By engaging with animals and nature, these young individuals learn compassion, responsibility, and gain essential life skills.

The project improved the quality of practical education by renovating the mini-farm and by actively involving clients in its day-to-day operations. These improvements are expected to foster a sustainable learning environment that prepares clients for future employment and active societal participation.

7. Samaritán

 Samaritán had established a project to enhance the mobility of its caregivers and the efficiency of home care services. They acquired a car, which enabled quicker and more effective visits to clients, ensuring timely and personalized care.

The car purchase facilitated caregivers in their daily tasks, allowing for better communication with families and quicker response to client needs. This investment significantly improved service quality and client satisfaction, many of whom suffer from physical disabilities limiting their movements.

The project was notable for its focus on improving logistical support for caregivers, thereby enhancing the overall efficacy of social services in Martin. It represented a practical solution to the challenges of providing home care in a large urban area.

8. Sewn Bag

 Sewn Bag, a social enterprise based in a community centre in Košice, had been employing disadvantaged job seekers to carry out tailoring work. The enterprise employed seven people, including one disadvantaged and three vulnerable individuals. They focused on reintegrating approximately 15 disadvantaged applicants back into the labor market annually, fulfilling the enterprise's social mission.

The enterprise planned to expand its operations to employ 15 to 20 people by moving to a larger facility and upgrading its infrastructure. This expansion was necessary to accommodate more disadvantaged employees and to diversify the job opportunities offered, thereby increasing the enterprise's contribution to society.

To facilitate this growth, Sewn Bag sought to improve production capacity and operational flexibility. They intended to purchase new economic software for warehouse, order management, and accounting, along with necessary equipment such as various designs of sewing machines and ironing equipment. This strategic upgrade aimed at providing disadvantaged workers with better job opportunities and training in a more suitable work environment.

9. NGO Hockey Talents MHK 32 Liptovský Mikuláš


9. NGO Hockey Talents MHK 32 Liptovský Mikuláš

 The NGO Hockey Talents MHK 32 in Liptovský Mikuláš had focused on promoting youth ice hockey, offering young athletes aged 5-18 the opportunity to engage in sports. The organization employed 15 full-time staff and was supported by 20 volunteers, dedicated to providing conditions that enhanced the sports performance and overall well-being of young players.

Recognizing the financial barriers some families faced in purchasing necessary sports equipment, especially costly goalie gear, the NGO aimed to ensure no child was left behind due to lack of resources. They actively sought sponsors to procure hockey equipment, thereby making sports accessible to all children, regardless of their economic background.

The project was innovative in its holistic approach to youth development through sports. By integrating physical activity with moral and social education, the NGO not only aimed to cultivate skilled athletes but also well-rounded individuals. This program helped in building strong personalities, fostering friendships, and ensuring that sports remained a vital part of the participants' lives, contributing positively to their social and psychological health.

10. COR Centrum n. o.


10. COR Centrum n. o.

 COR Centre n. o. had focused on integrating adult individuals recovering from addiction through a specialized resocialization program. The Centre for Children and Families, employing 11 full-time and 2 part-time employees, alongside 4 volunteers, carried out this program, which aimed at overcoming the psychological, physical, and social consequences of addiction.

The project introduced a ceramic workshop for producing porcelain, an activity chosen based on client interest in creative and manual skills. This workshop was intended to operate in the center's rehabilitated basement, offering clients a conducive environment for learning new skills and fostering an interest in craftwork as a vital part of their rehabilitation process.

The initiative to establish a ceramic workshop was innovative, particularly in how it adapted the physical space to suit rehabilitative needs. It provided a non-demanding physical activity that served both men and women, promoting gender equality and aesthetic sensitivity among clients. This project not only aimed to develop job skills but also intended to facilitate the broader social reintegration of individuals recovering from addiction by enhancing their work readiness and self-esteem.

11. NOZ Krehké Sovičky

 OZ Krehké Sovičky had focused on advancing physiotherapeutic methods for children with physical and mental disabilities, including those with postural deficits such as poor posture and flat feet. The NGO used both outpatient and residential physiotherapy services to activate and support the physical development of children and their families.

The project aimed to incorporate new diagnostic technologies like the ALBERT 3DFIT SCANNER and iPad Air to enhance the analysis of standing and walking postures. This technology was intended to improve postural management through regular physiotherapy and appropriate orthotic equipment, aiding in long-term therapeutic strategies.

OZ Krehké Sovičky sought to equip parents and home therapists with the tools and knowledge needed to apply therapeutic practices effectively at home. This initiative included purchasing new rehabilitation aids and optimizing their website to better serve families and practitioners. The project was innovative in its approach to integrating modern technology into physiotherapy, providing detailed, real-time feedback on therapy effectiveness and necessary adjustments, thus facilitating more tailored and effective treatment plans for young beneficiaries.

12. Top Art

 Top Art had focused on enhancing the work and social integration environment for individuals with disabilities through the establishment of a more dynamic and accessible workspace. This protected shelter provided employment and a platform for disabled individuals to express and develop their creativity, thereby boosting their self-confidence and public perception.

The project aimed to refurbish and improve the existing workshop facilities to include a mini-gallery. This space was designed to not only showcase the artistic works of disabled employees but also to function as a sales and presentation area for products crafted in other protected workshops, fostering a broader community interaction.

The initiative was innovative in its approach to breaking down social and employment barriers for people with disabilities. By enhancing the workspace and creating a mini-gallery, Top Art provided disabled individuals with new job opportunities and a public platform to display their talents, thereby challenging societal perceptions and encouraging a more inclusive community view towards disability.

13. Diecézna charita Rožňava

 Diecézna charita Rožňava had dedicated itself to uplifting the most needy through continuous education and professional development aimed at reintegrating clients into society. With a workforce of 40 full-time and 3 part-time employees, supported by 3 part-time clients and 3 volunteers, the organization focused on building crucial life and job skills among its beneficiaries.

The project was structured to teach clients essential computer skills such as using a PC, crafting a CV, and navigating online job markets—skills crucial for modern employment. Additionally, it aimed to enhance the communication abilities of clients, allowing them to present their experiences positively and effectively in the job market.

By improving both the qualifications of its staff and the employability of its clients, Diecézna charita Rožňava was creating a robust environment for social reintegration. The project was innovative in its approach to use education as a tool for social change, specifically tailored to the needs of the most vulnerable populations within the Rožňava diocese.

25. októbra 2023 došlo k zmene členov Správnej rady - pána Jean-Yves Cojean nahradila pani Cecile Droux a pána Balthazaara Schlumberger nahradila pani Antoinette De Rochebouet.

S účinnosťou odo dňa 30.11.2022 došlo k zmene v nadačnej listine Nadácie a to tak, že v zmysle zmeneného článku 2 Nadačnej listiny sa zmenil názov Nadácie na Nadácia Via Pribina (Via Pribina Foundation). Zmena nadačnej listiny bola vzatá na vedomie Ministerstvom vnútra SR dňa 13.4.2023.

Poznámky k hospodáreniu nadácie v roku 2023

truktúra nákladov správy je vypracovaná v zmysle Zákona o nadačiach 34/2002 Z.z. § 28 odst. 2. Rozpočet výdavkov na správu nadácie za rok 2023 bol schválený uznesením Správnej rady zo dňa 30.11.2022.

Nadácia v roku 2023 nevykazovala účtovný zisk ani stratu. Po skončení účtovného obdobia do dátumu zostavenia účtovnej závierky nenastali udalosti osobitného významu, ktoré by mali vplyv na verné zobrazenie skutočností v účtovnej závierke. Nadácia bude naďalej pokračovať vo svojej činnosti aj v ďalšom účtovnom období.

Správca, členovia Správnej rady a revízor nadácie neobdržali za výkon svojej funkcie žiadnu finančnú odmenu. Nadácia Via Pribina nemala počas roka 2023 zriadený žiadny nadačný fond.

Changes in bodies of the foundation

On 25th October 2023, the members of the Board of Directors changed - Mr Jean-Yves Cojean was replaced by Ms Cecile Droux and Mr Balthazaar Schlumberger was replaced by Ms Antoinette De Rochebouet.

With effect from 30th November 2022, the Foundation's Foundation Charter was changed so that in accordance with the amended Article 2 of the Foundation Charter, the name of the Foundation was changed to Via Pribina Foundation (Via Pribina Foundation). The change of the Foundation Charter was notified to the Ministry of Interior of Slovak Republic on 13th April 2023.

Notes to the economy in 2023

Structure of administration expenses is made according to the Law for Foundations. The budget for the administration expenses for 2023 was approved by the Board of Directors within its decision act on 30th November 2022.

The Foundation did not report an accounting gain or loss in 2023. There have been no events of special significance subsequent to the end of the financial year to the date of the financial statements that would affect the fair presentation of the facts in the financial statements. The Foundation will continue its activities in the next financial year.

The Trustee, members of the Board of Directors nor Foundation's Supervisor did not receive any compensation for their work. The Foundation Via Pribina had not established any Fund at the foundation during the year 2023.
